All Student counts are duplicated. Meaning a student is counted more than once if they transitioned between facilities or if they left a facility and returned within the same school year.

Who are the students?

Institutional Education serves young people under the age of 22 who are involved in the justice system.

Compared to the rest of the state, these students are disproportionately:

- Eligible for special education services (38.25%, 15.5%).
- Experiencing homelessness (33.7%, 3.3%).
- Involved in the foster care system (13.0%, 0.2%).
- Predominantly male (77.2%, 51.5%).
- From low-income households.
- From diverse racial and ethnic backgrounds.

HB 1295 Disaggregation

Required OSPI to annually collect and post data related to IE programs by:

- · Gender.
- Race.
- Ethnicity.
- Age.

HB 1295 Data Elements


Required data elements:

- Individualized education programs.
- Access to relevant instruction.
- Student attendance.
- Education status upon entry.
- Education progress during residency.
- Education attainment during residency.
- Long-term education and workforce outcomes.





Attendance (HB 1295 Data Set)




Regular Attendance defined as averaging less than 2 absences per month

9th Grade On Track (HB 1295 Data Set)




9th grade on track defined as completing all attempted in credits in a their 9th grade year

Credits Earned (HB 1295 Data Set)




Credits earned include credits earned at any institutional education facility

Credits Earned by IEP (HB 1295 Data Set)





Graduation Pathways (HB 1295 Data Set)





Education Delivery Options

Joint-Select Committee

Option 1: (OSPI Preliminary Recommendation):

- JDC and Long-Term Ed. Delivery: ESDs
- Community Facilities Ed. Deliver: School Districts

Option 2:

- JDC Ed. Delivery: ESDs, but OSPI explores the joint delivery of education services through ESD and School District partnerships.
- CF/Long Term Institutions Ed. Deliver: School Districts

SHB 1827

Option 3*:

- "Preserves the role of school districts in providing basic education services to justiceinvolved students"
- JDC Ed. Delivery: ESDs and School Districts
- CF/Long Term Institutions Ed. Deliver: School Districts



Next Steps

- **Explore and implement recommendations** from the Joint-Select Committee and potential 2025 legislation.
- Continue stakeholder work with additional input:
 - Youth voice, both currently and formerly involved in IE.
 - County leadership and additional Juvenile Court Administrators.
 - Additional on-the-ground staff at facilities.
- **Continue collaboration** across OSPI, DCYF, and local IE partners to support students and staff.
